

Parishioner John Gruss spent close to 300 hours hand-crafting the new Vesting Room cabinet!



Mike Brinkac

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13. 34-35)

Mike is the "other half" to Nancy Brinkac, our Coordinator of



Christian Formation. Mike and Nancy, happily married for 38 years, have two children and one grandchild. It was their son, Chris, for whom you prayed during his military deployment to the Middle East. In marriage, they have shared a lifetime of challenges, adventures, and opportunities – they are a team!

Two years ago, Mike and Nancy moved here from the Eastern Shore of Maryland, a familiar process since they moved over a dozen times

during Mike's 28 year career in the U.S. Navy. After retirement from the Navy, Mike worked several years with a defense contractor in Northern Virginia while Nancy finished her career with the Justice Department. It was then that they decided to prepare for follow-on vocations, and both went back to school. Nancy chose Education for Parish Service at Trinity College, and Mike chose Environmental Science and Policy at George Mason University.

While Nancy served, on and off, at their local parish, Mike's environmental career never fully materialized. Consequently, he took a job as a Disabled Veterans Employment Specialist and worked in one of the poorest counties in that area. What impressed him most were the working poor who, despite their best efforts, could not make ends meet. It was here that his interest in social justice took root. After focusing on the Gospel Message, he organized and became the Chairman of the Social Concerns Committee at his parish.

Then Nancy's call to serve as a Coordinator of Christian Formation led them to Incarnation and Mike joined our Social Justice Committee and helps with PACEM and IMPACT. Mike recently revived the Legislative Advocacy Program. On-going efforts include voter registration, preparations for the November elections, national health care reform, and Catholic Lobby Day 2010. The aim of the advocacy program is to ensure that our state and federal representatives enact legislation that reflects the Principles of Catholic Social Teaching as laid out by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Mike also supports the Christian Formation program, earning him the title of "Chair Man" because, during the school year, Mike assembles the classrooms for weekend classes only to disassemble them again on Sunday evening. He also does the logistics for special events in the Parish Hall and the Activities Center. Along with Tony Sapino, he provides a security presence for our youth during Sunday evening Christian Formation.

In addition to social justice, Mike's interests include environmental stewardship and fishing. He volunteers with the Rivanna Conservation Society and the Jefferson Chapter of Trout Unlimited. A related program that allows him to blend social justice

Why 7 Love Incarnation. . .

*I was brought to Incarnation by a friend. He suggested that the Church of the Incarnation might be the right place for me. I had visited other churches and had not been very happy with my experiences there. By the end of the Mass, I felt that I was home. The following Sunday, I returned to Incarnation alone. That is to say, no one accompanied me, but I did not feel alone. Sometime, within the first two months, one of the ushers approached me and said, "We have seen you here the last few Sundays, so what do you want to do? You have to do something." Within a couple of months, I became an usher. A few years ago, I was confirmed and received into full communion. Since that first Sunday, I have always felt that I was, and am, a part of the Incarnation family. This parish community has been the one constant in my life during these past years. I feel that my weeks end and begin here every Sunday. Sometimes I wonder how I would have made it here if I had not been brought to Sunday. Then, I think: I do not have to wonder; it had all been planned for me. Why I love Incarnation: it is home.
